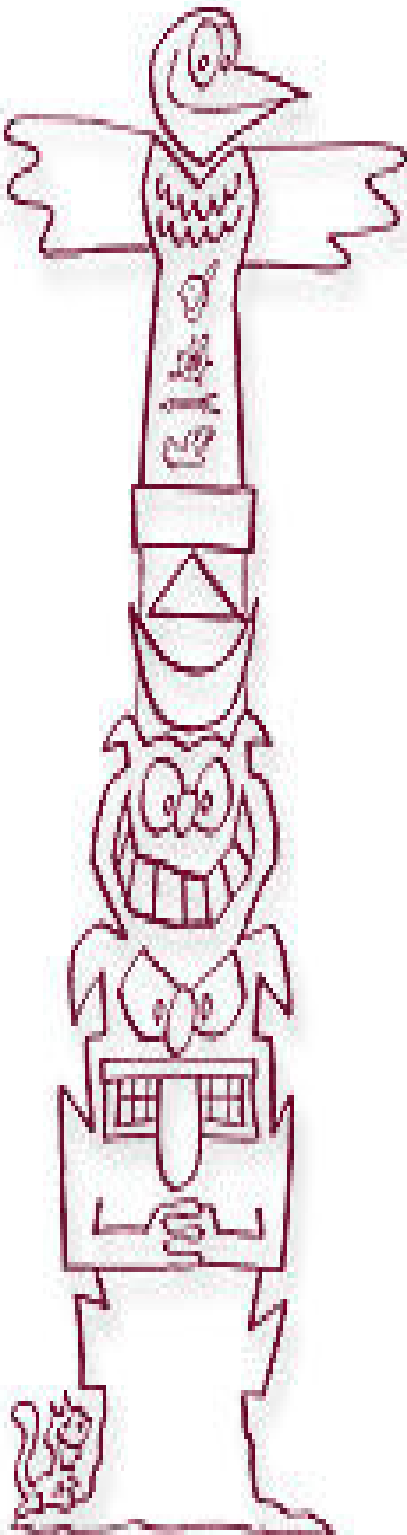

James Goodenough -

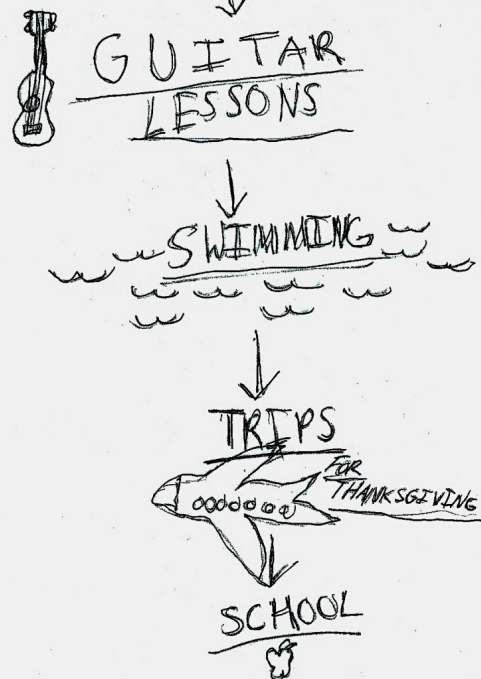
Hey Everyone! Since I left camp I have been on many very exciting adventures. At the end of the summer I went with my family to Italy. The gelato was awesome! In October I went out to

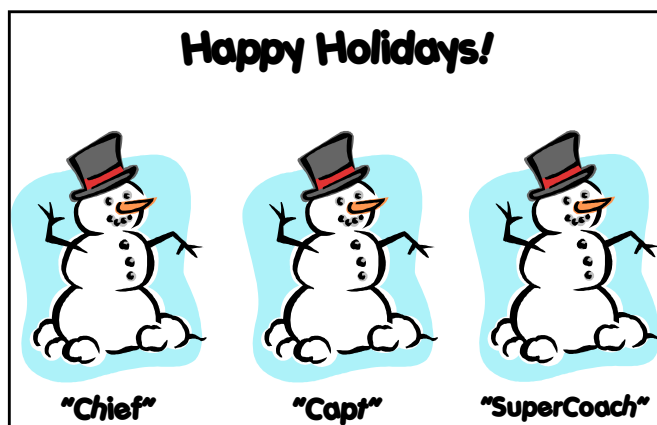
